

SAAPPG Big Book Study Thursday PM Script

Opening:

Welcome to this Big Book Study Telemeeting for sobriety from sex addiction.

Now let's take a period of silence to meditate and invite Higher Power to our meeting. We'll follow that with the Serenity Prayer (or other suitable prayer).

God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference.

WE OF Sex Addicts Anonymous are more than one hundred men and women who have recovered from a seemingly hopeless state of mind and body. To show other sex addicts precisely how we have recovered is the main purpose of this book. For them we hope these pages will prove so convincing that no further authentication will be necessary. We think this account of our experiences will help everyone better understand the sex addict. Many do not comprehend that the sex addict is a very sick person. And besides, we are sure that our way of living has its advantages for all.

Hello, everyone. My name is _____ and I am a (recovered) sex addict. Our Group Conscience has elected to use the Big Book of A.A. as its basic text for sobriety from sex addiction. Time and experience have proven it to be the most successful approach to the Steps no matter what the addictive problem may be. More importantly, this is what worked for us.

The study leader is responsible for keeping the meeting focused on the Big Book passages and can interrupt for that purpose. If you find yourself saying "I" or "me", you may be getting off track.

There will be fellowship after the meeting. If you are new, coming back, or have questions, please stick around, we really would like to get to know you better. Members from this group who are willing to sponsor will announce their names and phone numbers.

_____ will be our study leader tonight. They will be using the Dallas SAA PPG Big Book Study Guide to better understand the selected passages from our sobriety instruction manual. _____ will read a question and call upon a member to read the next sentence out of the Big Book which is designed to be the answer.

Study Leader Introduction:

My name is _____, and I am a sex addict. I'll be your study leader this evening. Before we begin our study we are going to review a Tradition. This weeks Tradition is ____ and I've asked _____ to read the long form of the Tradition followed by the short form and to offer some comments.

Closing:

Our group conscience believes that the place to check-in or get current is with your sponsor. The Primary Purpose program requires a sponsor for daily inventory. If you need a sponsor, we can help. Will those members who have taken these steps by the directions in the Big Book and had the promised spiritual awakening, please announce your names and phone numbers.

Will those of you who are not available to sponsor but would still like to offer support and fellowship, please share your phone numbers now.

Our 7th Tradition states that every group ought to be fully self-supporting declining outside contributions. SAA meetings around the world normally pass the basket at this time to accept the voluntary contributions of its members. Since that is not possible in a telemeeting, we ask that you make a contribution online to either the Big Book Study Intergroup at saa-bigbook.org or the Telemeeting Intergroup at saatalk.info.

Face to face groups around the world give out chips to celebrate significant milestones of sobriety. This is not possible in our telemeeting, but we would still like to celebrate these milestones of recovery by acknowledging those who are celebrating. We have chosen to celebrate increments of 1 month, 2 months, 3 months, 6 months, 9 months, and annual birthdays. Is there anyone here celebrating one of these milestones?

As S.A.A. members the most important symbol of our willingness is a desire chip. A desire chip signifies our desire to stop our addictive sexual behaviors for good and for all, though we stay sober just one day at a time. And even though it is not possible to hand these out in our telemeeting, we would still like to acknowledge anyone who wants to commit to our way of living. Is there anyone here that would like to begin their journey to sobriety this evening?

Fellowship:

Group Conscience Script:

The Thursday Night SAAPP Group uses the Twelve Traditions as outlined in the Big Book to help guide our Group Conscious decision making so that we may stay unified and focused on reaching the addict who is still suffering.

Would someone please read The Twelve Traditions, the short form, p. 562 of the AA Big Book.

Will the Secretary please read the minutes from last month's group conscience meeting?

In keeping with our traditions, this group rotates service positions. We need a Trusted Servant to open and close the meeting for the next month. Suggested guidelines for this service position are to have an SAA Big Book sponsor and to be working the steps in SAA using the Big Book.

— For Reference Only —

Robert's Rules – Very short version

- Any present member may propose a motion.
- Any other present member may second the motion.
- Motions are made and seconded, then discussed.
- All present may speak to the issue during discussion.
- All present who wish to speak must be heard.
- When the vote is called (i.e. How to vote):
- All in favor state name and say "Aye". [pause]
- All opposed state name and say "Nay".

- After a vote, the members voting in minority may speak to try to convince the majority to reconsider the motion.
- A motion to reconsider can be called only by someone who voted in the majority (no second required). If the original minority loses a second time the vote stands.
