

Script for the 6:15am Central SAA Daily Call for Women

(Note: Trusted Servant should arrive about 5 minutes before the start of the call and take the names of callers as they check in.)

Welcome to the 6:15am Central SAA Daily Call. This meeting is open to any woman 18 years of age or older who desires to stop their compulsive sexual behaviors, there are no other requirements. We take turns answering three questions. We have come to believe it is possible to be brief and still share in a way which is honest and meaningful, and to commit to what it takes to stay sober, just for today.

We respectfully ask all participants to refrain from using either profanity or explicit sexual descriptions. We also ask participants to please remember to mute your phones when you're not speaking. If your phone does not have the mute feature, you may *6 to mute and *6 to unmute. Finally, if at all possible, please write down the names of the person who comes before and after you in the lineup. So far we have, on the call...*(Trusted servant lists all in order, starting with self. DO NOT ASK FOR ANY NEW ARRIVALS AT THIS TIME.)*

Let's start the meeting with a moment of silence, for those who still suffer inside and out of the room, followed by the Serenity Prayer. The trusted servant will say the prayer aloud and others may say it silently to themselves.

First, a moment of silence.

God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference.

(Trusted servant takes names of any new comers joining the call.) I'll now read the order of the participants. I am X in Y and I'll pass to A in B who will pass to C in D, and so on. *(Let the last person know they will pass back to the chair.)*

Question 1: Do you admit you are powerless over sexual addiction and with your Higher Power's help, are you willing to seek sobriety and recovery today? *(Trusted servant answers the question and passes, etc.)*

(When the last person has passed back to the chair.).....

Has anyone else joined us for question 1? *(State the bottom of the order from the person before the new arrivals through the new arrivals and have the new arrivals answer the question. Again, note the new last person will pass back to the chair. Trusted servant also notes any changes in the lineup for folks who have said they are leaving the call.)*

We will now move on to Question 2. There is a one-minute time limit for question two. At the end of a minute, I will quietly and gently say "Time" and please wrap up your share.

Question 2: Is there anything in the past 24 hours or anything in the upcoming 24 hours that endangers your sobriety, and what solutions can you use to overcome temptations or handle life today? (*Trusted servant answers the question and passes, etc.*)

(*When the last person has passed back to the chair.*).....

By group conscience, if you have joined the call after question 2 started, we respectfully ask you to wait and answer the questions in fellowship. This will allow participants already on the call to complete their check-in in a timely manner. Now onto question three.

Question 3: Name one thing you are grateful for and are you willing to turn your will and your life over to God, as you understand God? (*Trusted servant answers the question and passes, etc.*)

(*When the last person has passed back to the chair.*) Now is time for announcements.

We welcome any newcomers to the call and suggest in addition to this call, you attend a conventional face-to-face or telemeeting to determine if the program is right for you.

After the meeting, fellowship will be open for anyone who has a question about the program or just wants to continue fellowship. Fellowship will remain open as long as there are two callers on the line. If you hear music, it means you are the last caller and fellowship is closed.

Are there any other announcements for the good of the fellowship?

(*After announcements are complete*)

Let's end the meeting with a moment of silence, for those who still suffer inside and out of the room, followed by the third step prayer.

First, a moment of silence.

God, I offer myself to thee, to build with me and to do with me as thou wilt. Relieve me of the bondage of self that I may better do thy will. Take away my difficulties as victory over them may bear witness to those I would help of thy power, thy love and thy way of life. May I do thy will always. Amen.

Thank you for allowing me to be of service, we will be back at 6:15 am central tomorrow and I wish everyone have a safe, sane, and sober day. The formal portion of the call is now over, fellowship is now open.

The following are two notes which can be used at appropriate time:

1. When the disrupter calls in, it is appropriate to say the following one time to let newcomers know what is going on:

On occasion this meeting is interrupted by a person whose sole intent is to disrupt the meeting. By group conscience, it is the practice of this meeting not to address the disrupter and to proceed with the meeting.

2. When a newcomer is on the line who does not know and therefore is not following the meeting format.

Pardon my interrupting your share, by group conscience this meeting is a check-in meeting, which means our shares are brief and focused on only each of the questions asked.
