

Moderator Script



Beginning the Meeting

Welcome to Late Night Recovery, a 60-minute closed, mixed meeting of Sex Addicts Anonymous. My name is _____, I'm a sex addict and your moderator for this evening.

Opening Prayer

Let's begin the meeting with a moment of silence for those who are still suffering followed by the Serenity Prayer. I say a line and the group repeats.

**God, grant me the serenity, to accept the things I cannot change, the
courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference.**

Technology Note

We only have two strict rules on this call:

1. Please stay muted when you aren't sharing by pressing Star 6 instead of using the mute on your phone, and
2. We ask everyone to only use the words "acting out" to describe our specific addiction.

We use a technology to prevent disruption, so your number is visible to the moderator; if you are unmuted you may be muted, disconnected, or dropped.

Read next part only if there is anonymous caller on the dashboard.

We do not accept anonymous calls, which are muted and dropped. Please call back unblocking your number. We appreciate your help in keeping this call clear, and safe.

Readings

Would someone please read the 12 steps on page 20 in the SAA Green Book?

Get name of reader.

Moderator can read the 12 steps if no one responds.

1. We admitted we were powerless over addictive sexual behavior - that our lives had become unmanageable.
2. Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
3. Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood God.
4. Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
5. Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
6. Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
7. Humbly asked God to remove our shortcomings.
8. Made a list of all persons we had harmed and became willing to make amends to them all.
9. Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.
10. Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.
11. Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood God, praying only for knowledge of God's will for us and the power to carry that out.
12. Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to other sex addicts and to practice these principles in our lives.

Tradition of the Month

The Tradition of the Month is...

January: Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon SAA unity.

February: For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority — a loving God as expressed in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.

March: The only requirement for SAA membership is a desire to stop addictive sexual behavior.

April: Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or SAA as a whole.

May: Each group has but one primary purpose — to carry its message to the sex addict who still suffers.

June: An SAA group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the SAA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property, and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.

July: Every SAA group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.

August: Sex Addicts Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.

September: SAA, as such, ought never be organized, but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.

October: Sex Addicts Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the SAA name ought never be drawn into public controversy.

November: Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, TV, and films.

December: Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

Welcome Newcomers

Now is the time to welcome newcomers. We introduce ourselves with just our first name and where we are from. Do we have any newcomers to this call or SAA In general tonight?

Welcome! Please stay around until fellowship to get phone numbers, or to ask questions.

Introductions

Now is the time for introductions. This is not the time for sharing; we simply introduce ourselves by first name only, and where we are from.

Topics

We have three topics, one of which is a newcomer tool. We ask that you keep topics brief, and to a few words. Who has a suggestion for a topic related to sex addiction recovery?

Boundaries

Before we begin sharing, let me go over boundaries: We do not engage in crosstalk, which means to interrupt or directly respond to the shares of other members or give advice, this meeting is for people over 18, please don't mention specific names of websites, movies, etc., and only the moderator may interrupt a member who is speaking.

And remember our two standard rules — keep muted when you aren't sharing by pressing Star 6 instead of using the mute on your phone, and only use the words "acting out" or "healthy sexuality" to describe addictive behaviors, rather than using explicit descriptions or offensive language.

The focus of this meeting is the solution rather than the problem. We share our experience, strength and hope.

Spiritual Timekeeper

If there are 25 or less participants, the moderator may extend shares to 3 minutes.

The time limit for each share is 2 (or 3) minutes. Is there someone willing to be the spiritual timekeeper?

Get name of timekeeper.

Sharing

We now open the meeting for sharing. You can talk about these topics, or just get current. Remember to mute your phone using the star six key if you are not talking. When sharing, please try to keep background noise to a minimum so that you can be heard clearly. When you hear the timekeeper call time, acknowledge the timekeeper and in fairness to the others wrap up your share.

Who would like to start?

If the meeting exceeds 70 participants, the moderator has the option to institute a lightning round for the last 15 minutes, with one-minute shares.

Closing & LNR Promises

Begin closing at ten before the hour.

Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions. What you heard was spoken in confidence and should be treated as confidential.

We use the Late Night Recovery Promises as posted on our tab on saataalk.info. Can someone read those?

Moderator can read the late night promises if no one responds.

LNR meets seven days a week; here are seven promises for those who work the program, commit to sobriety, and seek spiritual growth:

1. We will find a new freedom from addictive obsession.
2. We will learn to be present during emotional and physical intimacy, and to express love in healthy ways.
3. We will deepen our compassion and forgiveness of others and ourselves.
4. We will pursue the company of people who accept and respect us.
5. We will find belonging and true friendship with ourselves and with others.
6. We will ask for help, and offer it freely to others.

7. We will experience profound healing in the hands of a loving higher power.

Are these extravagant promises? **We think not.** They are ours if we work them.

The 7th Tradition states that “every group ought to be fully self- supporting, declining outside contributions.”

Newcomer Questions

Now we reserve 5 minutes for newcomers --anyone in their first 30 days of program--to ask questions.

If it is a business meeting, move this section until after the meeting.

Fellowship

We now move into open fellowship, which is a general conversation among members. Members talk about recovery topics or a wide range of outer circle topics, but of course refrain from explicit or disrespectful language. It's also an opportunity to share if you didn't get a chance to share during the meeting, or to leave a phone number. We are now in open fellowship.

The moderator stays on until after phone number sharing, at which time they can step out of the moderator role. However, the moderator should refrain from announcing their exit to give the remaining callers the impression that the call is still moderated.

Business Meeting

On the first Friday of the month only.

Welcome to the Late Night Recovery business meeting. My name is _____ and I'm a sex addict and your secretary. Let me begin by going over the basic principles:

- The business meeting has a time limit of 30 minutes.
- Any business not completed is tabled and will be old business in the next business meeting.
- All members have equal rights, privileges, and obligations.
- No person can speak until recognized by the chair.
- Personal remarks during debate are out of order.
- Only one question at a time may be considered, and only one person may have the floor at any one time.
- Members have a right to know what the immediately pending question is and to have it restated before a vote is taken.
- Full and free discussion of every main motion is a basic right.

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- A simple majority decides a question.
- The Chair should always remain impartial.
- Silence gives consent. Those who do not vote allow the decision to be made by those who do vote.
- When participating on any motions there is a 2-minute time limit for sharing your views.
- Remember you can also voice your opinion simply with your vote, without discussion.
